Where does the garbage belong to?

Don't worry, sorting garbage is easier than you might think. First of all, we differentiate between the garbage that is collected from your home and the garbage that you have to take to a collection point.

Help protect the climate!

Sorting household waste is important, because many items can be recycled and reused. But that requires everyone sorts the waste correctly into the bins provided. At the same time, this helps avoid smelly piles of rubbish at home and chaos at the collection points.

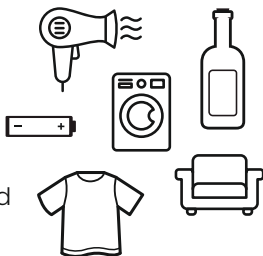
Usually picked up at home

1. packaging waste
2. paper waste
3. organic waste
4. all other household waste



To bring to containers or collection points

1. glass
2. old clothes
3. electronic waste
4. bulky waste
5. hazardous household waste



Large electrical appliances (page 13) and bulky waste (page 14) will also be collected from your home after registration.



The yellow bin at each house: Packaging waste

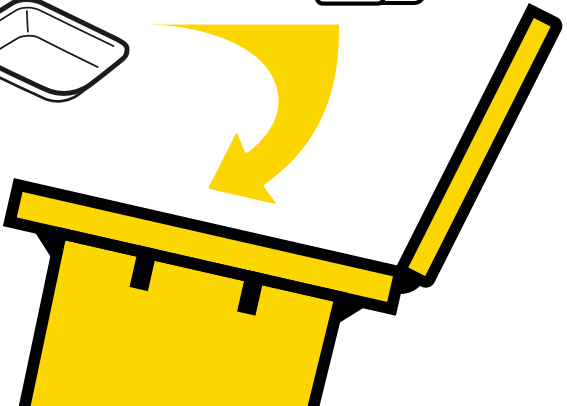
What belongs in?

- Disposable packaging made of metal, plastic and composite materials
- Metals, e.g. cans, bottle caps, aluminum foil, trays, lids
- Plastics, e.g. yogurt, margarine and other plastic food containers, washing and personal care bottles, foil, bags, Styrofoam etc., disposable cutlery and disposable tableware
- Composite materials, i.e. packaging made of different materials e.g. milk cartons (paper and plastic), juice, coffee, cocoa bags (paper, plastic and aluminum foil), frozen food packaging (paper and plastic)

The used packaging should be completely empty and put into the yellow bin. Rinsing is not necessary. Please do not put packaging into one another.

The blue bin at the house:

Waste paper

What belongs in?

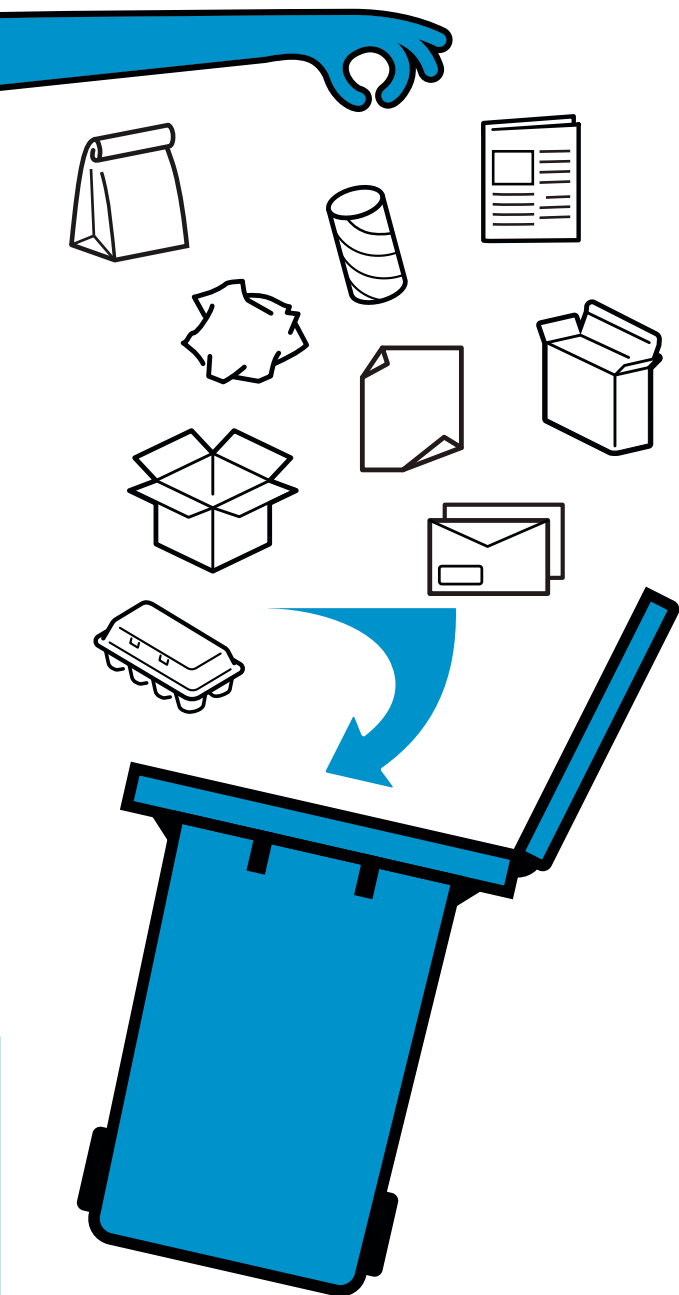
- Cardboard, paper packaging
- Cardboard boxes
- Writing paper
- Newspapers and magazines
- Catalogues
- Books

The green bin at each house: Organic waste

What belongs in?

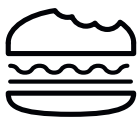
- Kitchen waste, e.g. food scraps, coffee filters, tea, egg shells, bones, meat scraps, frying fat, cooking oil, fruit and vegetable peelings, kitchen paper, spoiled food (taken out of the package)
- Garden waste, e.g. grass and tree cuttings, leaves, branches, flowers, fallen fruit
- Cat and small animal litter such as bird sand or hamster wool

The gray bin at each house: all other waste

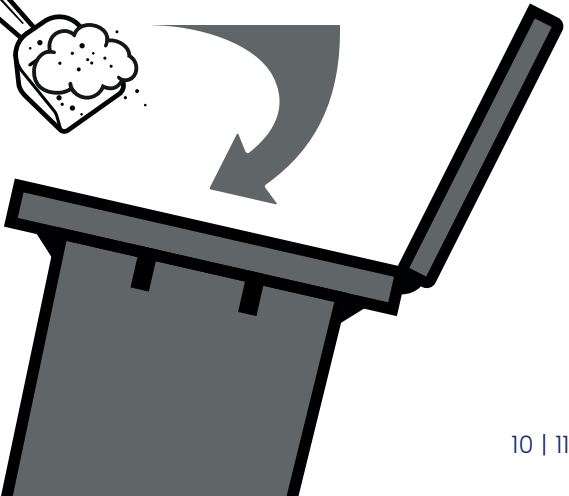
What belongs in?

- Non-recyclable waste, vacuum cleaner contents and bags, cleaning rags, sponges
- Hygiene products, diapers, toothbrushes
- Ashes, cigarette butts, disposable lighters
- Window glass, mirrors
- Photos, wallpaper, baking or thermal paper
- Rubber products, wood, treated wood
- Pens, plastic toys
- Porcelain, earthenware, foam
- Textile scraps, unusable shoes

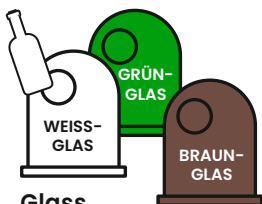
Collection points

Old clothes

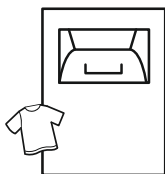
Old clothes are collected in special containers. The clothes must be clean, well packaged and free of rubbish. Textiles that can no longer be recycled, such as cleaning rags or badly worn clothing, belong in the gray residual waste bin. Old clothing and textiles such as bed linen or tablecloths, even if torn, are collected in containers.

Glass



Old glass must be thrown into glass containers. This includes drinks bottles, canning jars, jam jars, pharmaceutical jars and other packaging glass.

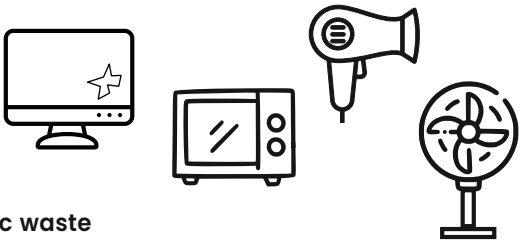
Please empty bottles and jars beforehand (put lids in the yellow bin!) and put the glass in the correct bin by color. Blue and red glass belongs with green glass. .

Please note: window glass, mirrors, drinking glasses, thermos flasks, earthenware and ceramics do not belong in the glass containers; these items should be put in gray bins at each house.

Electronic waste

You can bring used or broken electrical devices to various locations or have them picked up.

Please remove batteries first, if possible. Electrical and food stores that sell electronic devices with at least 800 square meters of sales area are obliged to take back small electrical devices (max. 25 cm) free of charge, including larger devices, provided that a new device is purchased at the same time.

Make sure to delete personal data from the devices beforehand.

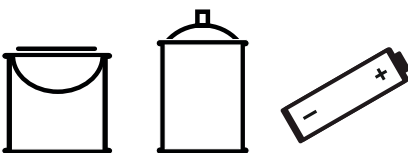


Hazardous household waste

Hazardous household waste must be delivered to the relevant authorities. This includes paint in cans and spray bottles, paints, turpentine, petrol, mineral oil, batteries, light bulbs, sanitary cleaners, medications, brake fluid, antifreeze, insect poisons, PU foam, fire extinguishers, acids and alkalis.

Bulky waste

Bulky waste includes furniture, mattresses, carpets, bicycles, strollers, charcoal and large electric grills, suitcases, child seats and large children's toys.

Bulky waste can be disposed of free of charge or collected on request at AGA gGmbH in Detmold.

Well-preserved furniture and household goods as well as usable electrical appliances can be delivered to the Recyclingbörse Bad Salzuflen (Otto-Hahn-Straße) or as well be collected on request.
